OVER 160 PARLIAMENTARIANS MEET IN OTTAWA

After many months of preparation and planning, the Inaugural Conference of the Global Organization of Parliamentarians Against Corruption (GOPAC) started with a bang last night at an opening night reception at the Ottawa Marriot.

The Interim Chair of GOPAC, John Williams (Canada) welcomed the delegates at a reception held at the Ottawa Marriott hotel last night.

"It is my pleasure to welcome so many delegates from around the world to the inaugural conference of GOPAC," said Williams, "While we have a lot of work to

Kilgour also emphasized the need for parliamentarians to rebuild the public's faith in their elected officials. "Whether you're from Africa, Asia, the Americas or Europe, you're here because you share a belief that, as public office holders, we have to be beyond reproach," said Kilgour. "We have to instill confidence in some very disillusioned publics; we need earn their trust and rebuild their faith."

Kilgour concluded by saying, "I hope that, as you turn your minds to developing the priorities and mandate of this new organization over the next few days, you can draw inspiration from what we hope to achieve - a world in which corruption and conflict are replaced by honesty and peace."
